Light at the Inn has a new Mission Statement: The mission of Light at the Inn is to provide support, through the cooperative efforts of an interfaith coalition, for those in the Dickinson/Iron County area who are struggling to find and maintain stable and secure shelter for themselves and their families. What does this mean?

- LATI will not be a Rotating Shelter for 2021-2022 season.
- LATI will now be a year round agency.
- LATI will continue as the Emergency Services Agency for Community Action Alger-Marquette (CAAM).
- LATI will be available to assist those who have emergency needs but do not fit the After Hours Voucher guidelines.
- LATI will continue to supply food cards, gas cards and possible extended hotel stays.

Donations may be sent to: LATI Norway Covenant Church 120 O'Dill Dr. Norway, MI 49870 Light at the Inn will now have a two phone system:

- Emergency Services phone This phone will take calls and issue vouchers for CAAM. (number has not yet been assigned)
- LATI Coordinator phone This phone is to provide information and referrals for homeless guests if their needs exceed an emergency hotel voucher. (906-282-5860)

Churches will sign up to answer phones in two week increments, November – May for either or both phones.

Our Saviour's is scheduled for the weeks of November 29th – December 13th and January 24th – February 7th.

Since guests will not be staying at churches, LATI has added on some extra areas of involvement for churches to participate in such as; transportation, gift cards, child care packages, personal care bags (gender appropriate), furniture & household items, food bags and camping supplies.

Our Saviour's has agreed to be responsible for personal care bags. These will be available to guests upon request throughout the year. Bags will be kept at OSL.


ATTENTION LIBRARY FANS



Pastor's Link

O Come, O Come, Emmanuel And ransom captive Israel, That mourns in lonely exile here Until the Son of God appear. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel!" There is something unique about the Season of Advent. For example, imagine being faithful lew 2,000 years ago. For thousands of years your people prayed to God to send a Messiah, for deliverance and salvation, God promised you that a Messiah, the Christ, would come to save you. You believe God's promise and you wait, and you wait, and you wait for that day to come. You pray, and you pray, and you pray for that day to come. There were probably many times you would have thought God forgot about you, or that maybe God changed His mind. But then all of a sudden, an angel appears to a young virgin; and a star leads 3 Wisemen from the east; shepherds in the fields see in the sky more angels than they can count, and there in a stable lies a little baby. In that manger rests everyone's prayers from thousands of years. In that manger rests all the promises God made to His people for thousands of years.

The season of Advent is unique. It is a season of longing. Advent is a time when our prayers focus upon that First coming of Jesus as well as the Second coming of Jesus. Like the Jews of thousands of years ago, we can also pray for the Christ to come, but this time to come again. Sometimes we may

feel like saying to God, "How long do we have to wait? Where is our deliverance?" Maybe we really aren't too different from the faithful who waited for the First coming of Jesus. There is one difference though, a very large difference. In many ways, we are more blessed than the lews of thousands of years ago. We are more blessed because we have much more than a promise; we have the promise's fulfillment in Jesus. Do we still wait? Of course we do! Do we still wrestle with our daily lives and in tears sometimes cry to God? Of course, and that will not change in this life. But what has changed is this - you actually get to hold your Deliverer in your hands every time you have the Lord's Supper and be reassured your deliverance has already come. You get to hear hymns speaking Words to comfort you, for your comforter has come. You have Jesus. Advent is a time to long for lesus to return again and to redeem all of heaven and earth. This is God's promise to you. He fulfilled this promise in Christ and one day, you will see it with your own two eyes when He returns again. Until that day comes, may our hearts always pray, "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel," Amen and Merry Christmas!
