*Confession and Absolution

[P] We gather together in the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

[C] Amen

- [P] If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. But if we confess our sins, God who is faithful and just will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness. Most merciful God,
- [C] We have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. For the sake of your Son, Jesus Christ, have mercy on us. Forgive us, renew us, and lead us, so that we may delight in your will and walk in your ways, to the glory of your holy name. Amen
- [P] Almighty God, in his mercy, has given his Son to die for us and, for his sake, forgives us all our sins. The Lord Speaks to Us

Reading: I Corinthians II: 23-32

"For I received from the Lord what I also handed on to you, that the Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took a loaf of bread, ²⁴ and when he had given thanks, he broke it and said, "This is my body that is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." ²⁵ In the same way he took the cup also, after supper, saying, "This cup is the new testament in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." ²⁶ For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes. ²⁷ Whoever, therefore, eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be answerable for the body and blood of the Lord. ²⁸ Examine yourselves, and only then eat of the bread and drink of the cup. ²⁹ For all who eat and drink without

discerning the body^[h] eat and drink judgment against themselves. ³⁰ For this reason many of you are weak and ill, and some have died. ^[i] But if we judged ourselves, we would not be judged. ³² But when we are judged by the Lord, we are disciplined^[i] so that we may not be condemned along with the world."

*Proclamation of the Gospel

[P] The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the 14th chapter.



Gospel: Mark 14: 22-31, 66-72

²² While they were eating, he took a loaf of bread, and after blessing it he broke it, gave it to them, and said, "Take; this is my body." ²³ Then he took a cup, and after giving thanks he gave it to them, and all of them drank from it. ²⁴ He said to them, "This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many. ²⁵ Truly I tell you, I will never again drink of the fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God."

When they had sung the hymn, they went out to the Mount of Olives. And Jesus said to them, You will all fall away, so for it is written,

'I will strike the shepherd, and the sheep will be scattered.'

²⁸ "But after I am raised up, I will go before you to Galilee." ²⁹ Peter said to him, "Even though all fall away I will not." ³⁰ Jesus said to him, "Truly I tell you, this day, this very night, before the cock crows twice, you will deny me three times." ³¹ But he said vehemently, "Even though I must die with you, I will not deny you." And all of them said the same.

⁶⁶ While Peter was below in the courtyard, one of the female servants of the high priest came by. ⁶⁷ When she saw Peter warming himself, she stared at him and said, "You also were with Jesus, the man from Nazareth." ⁶⁸ But he denied it, saying, "I do not know or understand what you are talking about." And he went out into the forecourt. Then the

cock crowed. ⁶⁹ And the female servant, on seeing him, began again to say to the bystanders, "This man is one of them." ⁷⁰ But again he denied it. Then after a little while the bystanders again said to Peter, "Certainly you are one of them, for you are a Galilean, and you talk like one." ⁷¹ But he began to curse, and he swore an oath, "I do not know this man you are talking about." ⁷² At that moment the cock crowed for the second time. Then Peter remembered that Jesus had said to him, "Before the cock crows twice, you will deny me three times." And he broke down and wept."

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.


Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

Reading of Psalm 22 & Stripping of the Altar

Psalm 22

- ¹ My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from helping me, from the words of my groaning?
- ²O my God, I cry by day, but you do not answer; and by night but find no rest.
- ³ Yet you are holy, enthroned on the praises of Israel.
- In you our ancestors trusted; they trusted, and you delivered them.
- ⁵ To you they cried and were saved; in you they trusted and were not put to shame.
- ⁶ But I am a worm and not human, scorned by others and despised by the people.
- ⁷ All who see me mock me; they sneer at me; they shake their heads;
- ⁸ "Commit your cause to the LORD; let him deliver—let him rescue the one in whom he delights!"
- ⁹Yet it was you who took me from the womb; you kept me safe on my mother's breast.
- On you I was cast from my birth, and since my mother bore me you have been my God.
- 11 Do not be far from me, for trouble is near, and there is no one to help.
- ¹² Many bulls encircle me; strong bulls of Bashan surround me;

- 13 they open wide their mouths at me, like a ravening and roaring lion.
- ¹⁴ I am poured out like water, and all my bones are out of joint; my heart is like wax; it is melted within my breast;
- ¹⁵ my mouth¹⁵ is dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue sticks to my jaws; you lay me in the dust of death.
- ¹⁶ For dogs are all around me; a company of evildoers encircles me; they bound my hands and feet.
- ¹⁷I can count all my bones. They stare and gloat over me;
- ¹⁸ they divide my clothes among themselves, and for my clothing they cast lots.
- ¹⁹ But you, O LORD, do not be far away!
 O my help, come quickly to my aid!
- ²⁰ Deliver my soul from the sword, my life from the power of the dog!
- Save me from the mouth of the lion!

 From the horns of the wild oxen you have rescued me.
- ²² I will tell of your name to my brothers and sisters;¹² in the midst of the congregation I will praise you:
- ²³ You who fear the LORD, praise him! All you offspring of Jacob, glorify him; stand in awe of him, all you offspring of Israel!
- ²⁴ For he did not despise or abhor the affliction of the afflicted;

he did not hide his face from men but heard when lw cried to him.

- ²⁵ From you comes my praise in the great congregation; my vows I will pay before those who fear him.
- The poor shall eat and be satisfied; those who seek him shall praise the LORD. May your hearts live forever!
- ²⁷ All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the LORD, and all the families of the nations shall worship before him.
- ²⁸ For dominion belongs to the LORD, and he rules over the nations.
- ²⁹ To him, indeed, shall all who sleep in the earth bow down; before him shall bow all who go down to the dust, and I shall live for him.
- ³⁰ Posterity will serve him; future generations will be told about the Lord
- ³¹ and[∞] proclaim his deliverance to a people yet unborn, saying that he has done it.
