
We are still collecting grocery receipts from SuperOne and Tadyach's Marketplace.

Sunday school and youth group happenings...



Greetings from Fortune Lake Lutheran Camp!

In the beauty of the transition that is fall in the Northwoods, we have some exciting news to share! Fortune Lake has been selected as the recipient for the 2022 CoVantage Cares Foundation Inc, Giving Tuesday Campaign! This means that CoVantage will match a portion of the funds raised from Giving Tuesday through the following two weeks (November 29 - December 13). The more we raise, the more potential for matching funds!

The money will be used to update our highest use buildings – duplexes, Emanuel Lodge, and the Dining Hall – making them more energy efficient and accessible and ensuring they'll be usable for many years into the future. You may remember that this project was initiated in early 2020, but was paused due to the pandemic. It's time for our traditional **Advent Lunch Gathering**!


