


An additional opportunity to serve others during Lent

At each Wednesday Lenten service, beginning with Ash Wednesday, we will collect one item needed for the kit. The kits will be finished utilizing church outreach funds or donations made toward this project. Additional items needed, not included on the schedule below, are large trash bags, rolls of paper towel, rags and leather work gloves (I pair for each kit, size L preferred). If there are funds donated toward this project left over, they will be donated to the NALC Disaster Response Fund.



Confirmation

Confirmation is on break during Lent. ALL confirmation students are encouraged to attend midweek services and will be helping with our soup suppers. Confirmation classes will resume Wednesday, April 19th.



This is the Faith, Hope, and Charity Window. It was given as a memorial in honor of Mrs. Frank Adams. The title of this window comes from the King James Version of I Corinthians 13:13. It reads: "And now abideth faith, hope, charity, these three; but the greatest of these is charity."

The succinct division of this window makes the cross very prominent. Of course, the cross symbolizes FAITH and that is the first part of the title of this window.

The next part of the title is HOPE. Like the ichthys (also known as a "lesus fish"), the anchor was a symbol used by very early Christians to signal safe places and homes in a time when Christians were persecuted. The reason the anchor was chosen as a sign is because it emphasizes the stability and safety of Christ as our hope. Hebrews 6:19 describes this hope as an anchor that is "firm and secure" (NIV), "sure and steadfast" (ESV), "strong and trustworthy" (NLT). A ship's anchor allows the vessel to remain fixed and unmoving regardless of the conditions at sea. Our faith in Jesus Christ keeps us from becoming "like a wave of the sea, blown and tossed by the wind" (lames 1:6). Jesus is a powerful and dependable anchor for our souls.

Finally, CHARITY is synonymous with love in this window. It is symbolized through the roses - one of the most recognized emblems of love worldwide. The red rose has come to commonly represent the shedding of Christ's blood and sacrifice for our sins.
