The church office is organizing a drive to collect items needed to make "Flood Buckets" for NALC Disaster Response. We have obtained a \$250 Thrivent grant for supplies and beginning with Ash Wednesday, and at each Wednesday Lenten service, we will collect one item needed for the kit. The kits will be finished utilizing church outreach funds or donations made toward this project. Additional items needed, not included on the schedule below, are large trash bags (contractor 3 mil), rolls of paper towel, rags and leather work gloves (1 pair for each kit, size L preferred). If there are extra funds donated toward this project, they will be further donated to the NALC Disaster Response Fund.

Pastor's Corner

This year Ash Wednesday (Feb. 14) and Easter (March 31) come quite early (more on that below). This means we will miss a few Sundays in Epiphany compared to the average year. This is year B in the three-year lectionary, which means that we will miss the story of Namaan in the book of 2nd Kings, chapter 5. I did a little research and am happy that the story comes up twice in the lectionary, but the other occurrence doesn't come until the summer of 2025. Therefore, I'm going to take this opportunity to write a bit about the story.

Namaan was a very successful general in the Aramean Army. They were a Semitic people that were related to the Israelites, but they were not Israelites. And yet Scripture says that the LORD, the God of Israel, had given Namaan and the King of Aram their great military victory (2 Kings 5:1).

Namaan found his way into the Holy Scriptures because he had leprosy. A Jewish girl, who had been captured by the Arameans in a raid, suggested that Namaan seek the help of a prophet in Samaria (modern day northern Israel), namely Elisha. The King of Aram sent a letter to Israel's King Jeroham. Eventually Namaan ended up at the door of Elisha's house. Elisha did not even go to meet Namaan but sent a messenger who told him, "Go and wash in the Jordan seven times, and your flesh shall be restored, and you shall be clean" (2 Kings 5:10).

This did not please Namaan; he was angry. He had expected that Elisha would come outside and dramatically call upon the LORD to heal him. Then Namaan asked why he came all the way to Israel to wash in the Jordan when the rivers in Damascus, where he lived, would work just as well. Namaan left "in a rage" (2 Kings 5:12).

Namaan's servant came and talked sense into him. He said, "if the prophet had commanded you to do something difficult, would you not have done it? How much more, when all he said to you was, "Wash, and be clean'?" (2 Kings 5:13). "So [Namaan] went down and dipped himself seven times in the Jordan, according to the word of the man of God, and his flesh was restored like the flesh of a little child, and he was clean" (2 Kings 5:14).

We are all a little bit, at least, like Namaan. We would rather that God help us in dramatic ways, and we would rather have some sort of difficult challenge from God so that we can become partially responsible for our own salvation. But God's actual words to us work differently.

I am telling this story now because it goes well with my sermon on The Baptism of Our Lord a few weeks ago. The devil loves to put the same thought in our head regarding Holy Baptism as he put in Namaan's head regarding the LORD's healing that he promised through Elisha. Baptism looks too easy. It doesn't look holy enough or dramatic enough. And yet just as God attached his promise, through Elisha, to Namaan's washing in the Jordan, God attached his forgiveness and promise of resurrection and life for you to the washing and word that you received in Holy Baptism. As Namaan's servant believed, it really is that simple. Namaan eventually washed and was clean. You have been washed in Baptism and now, in Christ, have a clean conscience before God (I Peter 3:21).



This year during our five Wednesday Lenten services (not counting Ash Wednesday) I will be preaching on the parts of the Small Catechism. This is an old Lutheran tradition in Lent that is worth continuing.
