



Your 2019 offering envelopes have been mailed. If you did not receive yours by the end of next week, please call the church office.


Also if you are on automatic giving and would still like to have envelopes let Christina, our Financial Secretary know.

It is such a blessing when we all share our abilities to further God's kingdom.




Sunday School is on break and will return Sunday, January 6th at 9:40am.

Pastor's Link

Advent and Christmas. Two seasons of the Church Year that fall in one month that reveal the very heart of God and speak the truth of God's Word: that God became human in order to save humankind from the condemnation we brought upon ourselves and the eternal death that awaited humans in this cursed and fallen world. God becoming human to save humans. Non-believers find this teaching ridiculous, and they think that we who hold this belief as delusional at worst, and foolish at best. They know nothing of God's sacrificial, unmerited love for them in sending His only begotten Son into our very flesh in order to be the savior of all of humankind.

God's Son was born to die that we might never die. God becoming human to save all humans. The fallen world around us finds the incarnation and birth of Christ ridiculous and offensive. They hear the story as a quaint little fable that is meant to make some moral point of generosity and good will toward our fellow man. How sad that the season that is suppose to focus on God's most precious gift to us has become the focal point of materialistic gain in the name of greed and works righteousness. The "prosperity gospel" is based on how we live, and whether we have been "naughty or nice" – it is the exact opposite of the true Gospel of Jesus Christ and the Theology of the Cross, where God gives His greatest gift to us without any merit on our part, indeed loving us while we were yet sinners and His enemies!

And in response to this twisting of God's gift to us, it seems there is even a growing rejection of the spiritual for the secular, ignoring that we are not earthly beings on a spiritual journey, but rather spiritual beings on an earthly journey...this place is not our home. We were hardwired on the cross and in our baptism for spirituality, for a relationship with God no matter how much we may try to ignore it. It is that "God-shaped hole" that exists in every human heart, that can only be filled with a personal relationship with Jesus Christ. Those who try to fill it with what the world offers will wander this earth in pain and loneliness. They will fill that void with some other form of spirituality that points away from Jesus and His love. In a time when the Good News of Jesus seems to be increasingly watered down to fit pop

culture's politically correct approval meter, we might be tempted to withdraw or to change our message. But this fallen world's need is the same as it always has been since that first bite of forbidden fruit – that is, the need in our heart remains the same: a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. This will only come by clearly, boldly, and lovingly proclaiming Jesus the Word in all His entirety and purity – or as we also state: 'To speak the truth in love'. God became human to save humans – to save those caught in false religions, materialism, secularism, paganism, atheism, or other forms of fallen man's natural religion based on works righteousness. By God's gracious Word alone through the Holy Spirit, He has opened our blind eyes to His Truth and breathed life back into our spiritually dead hearts. This He has done through faith in His blessed Son's Incarnation, death and resurrection. He has shown us His heart and brought us back into His family. And now He works through His Church, which is ALL of us, to shine this light of God's Word to all who so desperately need to hear it.


