Campaign Kick Off!

Beginning May 1st we are asking the congregation to pray, listen to temple talks, and carefully con-

sider giving to the roof fund. Thanks to the very generous memorial gift from Arlene Flom, our down payment has been paid in full – but we still have \$163,000 to raise. Every amount, great or small, is a contribution towards the work of our church. And to do the work of the church, we need a sound building. This roof will likely outlast us all – it is a gift for the future.

Look for the Roof Capital Fund Drive display created by Joy Nasi in the Fireside Room to see how we are progressing.

An important component of a successful capital fund drive is PRAYER. A special prayer group for this campaign has been formed consisting of Tania Taff, John Reed, Toby Carlson, Jim Meier, or Pastor Paul. They invite all congregants to join them.

Whether it is in person or at home, we offer the following prayer to use during the coming weeks:

Gracious Jesus, bless our church and our congregation. Lord help each of us prayerfully consider your house where we gather to confess our sins, hear your word, sing your praise, listen to the message of your love, grace and forgiveness and receive holy communion. Action Items

- To proceed with the recommendation from the building and maintenance committee to replace the roof and accept the proposal from Okler Roofing.
- To form a roof capital fund campaign committee to be comprised of the entire church council. The focus of the campaign will begin May 1, 2022 and run for six weeks.

Informational Items

- The fire alarm panel has been malfunctioning. Due to discontinuance of previous monitoring company, we will be looking into options for repair and monitoring. Council person in charge handbooks will be updated with more specific information on pull station locations and procedures when the alarm goes off.

Pastor's Corner

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our affliction, so that we may be able to comfort those who are in any affliction, with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God. For as we share abundantly in Christ's sufferings, so through Christ we share abundantly in comfort too. If we are afflicted, it is for your comfort and salvation; and if we are comforted, it is for your comfort, which you experience when you patiently endure the same sufferings that we suffer. Our hope for you is unshaken, for we know that as you share in our sufferings, you will also share in our comfort." 2 Corinthians 1:3-7

Have you felt in need of comfort? I know I have. The burdens of living in this sin-filled, cursed world continuously wear upon us. The attacks of Satan are relentless, as he seeks to rob us of our faith and joy in lesus Christ. The world is growing in its assaults against faithful Christianity, and are we witnessing the increase of the world calling evil good, and good evil. Whether you hurt either physically or emotionally, your suffering will find its meaning in Christ's suffering. Of course, our affliction doesn't pay for anyone's sins, much less our own. That's already over and done on the cross: "For our sake God made Him to be sin who knew no sin. so that in him we might become the righteousness of God" 2 Corinthians 5:21.

Our private pain finds meaning in the collective experience of all of Christ's beloved. Paul, in writing about the suffering he encountered in his ministry, saw affliction as the norm for all Christians. He saw his personal problems as mysteriously linked with the whole church—and the afflictions of Jesus Christ: "Now I rejoice in my sufferings for your sake, and in my flesh I am filling up what is lacking in Christ's afflictions, for the sake of his body, that is, the church" Colossians 1:24. That's the secret to finding persistent hope in the midst of our own suffering; seeing our affliction as our personal link to Jesus. Because Jesus is "a man of sorrows and acquainted with grief", we can be sure that we are not alone in our suffering. Jesus is there with us. Because He bore our misery ahead of us and experienced it in a human body just like ours, our pain is sanctified in His. Emotional or physical distress can be endured, not because we have sufficient grit and determination to push through it on our own, but because He is alongside of us. We have a Savior who was made of flesh and blood just like ours. He knows what He's saying when he invites you to come to Him with your worries and burdens: "Come to me, all who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light." Matt I I:28-30. Jesus truly knows what you are going through, He was fully human and this included feeling fear and anxiousness of what awaited Him on the cross. Yet He suffered with complete trust, also praying to the Father; "Not as I will, but as You will". He

would suffer all in our place that we may be saved from the true eternal suffering that justly awaited us. His payment has been made your payment, and by it you are forgiven all, and by trusting in that saving work, you are saved from suffering we cannot begin to imagine. Jesus knows YOUR suffering and sorrow. And He is with you as you endure it, and not without sympathy.

Christians don't need to pretend that tragedies never happen or suffering isn't miserable or pain doesn't hurt. We can afford to be honest with God. because He knows the depth of human suffering. We can confidently cry out to Him from the bottom of our fearful and anxious hearts, knowing we have a Father in heaven who shows compassion to his children. We have a Savior who wept at the grave of His dear friend Lazarus. And when we are at a loss for words, the Holy Spirit takes over, "interceding for us in sighs too deep for words." Romans 8:26. God tenderly invites our prayers, promising His attentive ear: "Call upon me in the day of trouble; I will deliver you, and you shall glorify me." Psalm 50:15. Indeed, we are NOT alone. Cry out unto our Lord in times of fear or anxiousness, in times of worry find a quiet place and open up your Bible. Read out loud to yourself from the Word of Life. Chew on it, and digest that Word! And use that Word to move you to prayer. Cry out to Him and know that He hears you, is with you, and will uphold you. The Holy Spirit Comforter will comfort you and give you His Peace.
