

Light at the Inn Rotating Shelter Statistics 2018 – 2019 Season

- The Shelter was open for 21 weeks or 147 nights, November 4, 2018 to March 31, 2019
- The Shelter was occupied all 147 nights minimum 5 guests, max 14
- Total individual guests : **33** -- 24 males, 9 females, 6 of these were veterans
- Total bed nights: **891** (number of guests per night x number of nights)
- Average age: 17 guests were 18 to 40 years; 16 guests were 40 years or older
- Length of stay per guest ranged from I night to 75 nights
- 21 guests stayed more than 1 week; 13 guests stayed more than 1 month
- II of our guests were able to secure their own apartments, I gentleman returned to his own home
- 5 guests chose to move to the Abundant Life Mission in Menominee, MI either during the season or at the close

Faith Stepping Stones



I'm sure some of you are familiar with our Faith Stepping Stones program. But for those who aren't or just need a refresher, this is for you.

During First Communion our 5th graders receive a wooden cross with 3

beads. By the time they graduate they will have a total of six beads. Each bead represents a milestone in their faith life.

Below is a list telling what each bead represents, along with the cross symbolizing First Communion.

- Baptism
- Entering Sunday School
- Receiving your Third Grade Bible
- Beginning Confirmation
- Your Confirmation Day
- Graduation

It is our hope that this cross will be a constant reminder of God's love for them as He guides and directs them through their life.

Keryx Weekend

Keryx is a Greek word meaning "herald". In the ancient world, a herald was one sent by his master to proclaim in public the master's message. He dared not change the announcement because it was not his own. His responsibility was only to proclaim it accurately. That is how Paul understood his gospel ministry. We, in Keryx, as Paul are mere servants proclaiming our Master's Good News.

Bruce Buckman & Jim Meier are on team for Keryx #50, May 2nd - May 5th at Marquette Branch Prison. They are requesting support from our Ultreya and Emmaus 4th Day communities in the form of palanca/agape, treats, prayer vigil participation, and even an opportunity for a group apostolic endeavor.

Please review the important palanca/agape instructions below.

Palanca/Agape Instructions:

Please note that all agape/palanca must be written expressions on paper ONLY, and with NO stickers of any kind on them. Please address your letters, "Dear Brother in Christ", and write of your support and God's love for the candidates. Do not include any identifying information such as your last name, address, phone number, etc. Use only your first name - no exceptions.

All agape/palanca for each individual prisoner will be placed in one large envelope and mailed at the end of the weekend. Therefore, it is not necessary for you to put your letters in envelopes. All letters are read by our volunteers for acceptability and are screened again by Department of Corrections personnel after their arrival at the prison via U.S. Mail. There will be as many as 28 men attending the Keryx. Please drop off your letters by 9am on Thursday, May 2nd at Our Saviour's. Thank you for taking the time to be a blessing and write to these men. Your notes are very powerful following the weekend and help to show Christ's love for them does not end after the weekend closing.

Treats:

Donations of home-baked treats are gratefully accepted for Keryx weekends. They would like to bring as many dozen treats as possible into the prison as a gift to the many corrections officers who go out of their way to allow them to come into the prison on these weekends. They bring in 300-350 dozen treats during the weekend. Please help them out by dropping off your home-baked treats (in disposable packaging please) by 9am on Thursday, May 2nd at Our Saviour's.

Prayer Vigil:

Vigil begins at 2:00pm on Thursday, May 2nd and runs through 3:00pm Sunday, May 5th. They ask that you commit to at least I hour of prayer during this time. Please pray for the prison population, prison staff, Keryx candidates and the Keryx Team that will be at Marguette Branch Prison. You do not have to go anywhere to join this Prayer Vigil. Pray at home, at work, in your car or wherever you are at the time that you sign up to pray. Please ask your friends and family to pray too. Please submit your names, town, and time slot to Bruce Buckman via email at mail.buckman @charter.net. Only your first name and town will be written on the Prayer Vigil Poster and placed where the candidates can see and know that you are praying for them during their weekend. It is very powerful when the candidates see that many people on the outside are praying for them.

The theme of our first April God Club gathering was Let Your Light Shine. Matthew 5:14-16 says: "You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."

We talked about how we sometimes want to act like the cool kids around us for a while, so we just turn our light off and we act like the world. When we feel like doing something for Jesus, we turn it back on again. When we don't stick up for someone that others are making fun of, we turn our light back off again.

We prayed for God to help us to let our lights shine ALL the time -- not just when it's easy. It's sometimes hard for us to do the right thing – but, He is always there to help us.

We made "stained glass" lamps from pretty glass punch cups to use in prayer and remind us to do good works to glorify God's name.

The next week's lesson was **"The Real Easter Egg."** There are many things that remind us of Easter. There are flowers, chocolate Easter bunnies, and pretty Easter baskets. One thing that all of us think of when we think of Easter is Easter eggs.

Miss Joy brought in an egg with the insides blown out. When she cracked it, we saw that it was empty. It reminded us that on Easter Sunday, when Jesus' followers went to His tomb, the tomb was empty. An angel was there to tell them, "He is not here; he has risen, just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay." Matthew 28:6 Jesus is alive, and because He is alive, we too can have a new life in Him.

Miss Terri, from the church office, gave us many pretty spring-colored beads and ribbons to which we added crosses to make beautiful necklaces -- reminding us of the Easter message.

Our third April gathering was our last for this school year. It is our tradition to celebrate our year with pizza and games. This has been such a delightful group of God Club Kids! We thank God for them and are so very grateful that their parents have made it possible for them to join us each Wednesday at church to learn about, practice, and celebrate God's love. We also want to express our appreciation to all at Our Saviour's for supporting us in this important ministry.

We are currently enrolling for the 2019-20 school year.

Our Spring Program will be held on Thursday, May 16th at 6:00pm in the church sanctuary.

April started with a week off for both classes for spring break. When the Pre-Kindergarteners and preschoolers came back to school the second week of April we got right to work learning about the Easter story. We placed much of our focus on Holy Week and the events leading up to Jesus' death and resurrection. We read the stories of Palm Sunday, Jesus praying in the Garden of Gethsemane and his trial before Pilate, Jesus on the Cross, and of course, His resurrection Easter morning! We made several projects to go along with the Easter story and both classes had a celebration with an egg hunt to celebrate.

For the remainder of the month the pre kindergarten class learned about seeds, how plants grow and what they need to live, and the parts of plants. We planted bean and carrot seeds and are currently watching them as they sprout and grow into little seedlings. We also did an experiment with carnations and food coloring to demonstrate how the stems of the flower carry water and nutrients to the other parts of the plant. The preschool class started a unit on weather, beginning with clouds and will continue this unit for the remainder of the year with lessons about rain, sunshine, wind, and rainbows. They will also learn about Noah's Ark during this time.

A few years ago, one spiritual authority summarized America's cultural religion as "Moral Therapeutic Deism" – wow! What in the world did that mouthful mean? Or as a good Lutheran would ask: What does this mean? It means that the general spiritual beliefs of Americans are as follows:

 A god exists who created and ordered the world and watches over human life on earth.
 God wants people to be good, nice, and fair to each other, as taught by most world religions.

3. The central goal of life is to be happy and to feel good about one's self.

4. God does not need to be particularly involved in your life except when you need him to resolve a problem.

5. Good people go to heaven when they die.

In other words, most Americans believe in a distant 'deity' who wants us to be nice to each other, and that will ultimately help us fulfill or attain the highest life goals of wealth, happiness and good self-esteem, and of course, heaven if you have been good enough. When you listen to most of the modern day 'oracles' (televangelists) you will often hear this belief system. Of course missing is any thought of sin, the need of forgiveness and the person and work of Jesus Christ as the sole means of life and salvation i.e. the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

First, our culture is absolutely fascinated by spirituality, and yet they seem to seek it everywhere except in church. The irony is that we in the church run everything on the Living and Abiding Word of God; the very means that the One True Living God comes to us in order to restore us back into His image. Next, our culture is captivated by mystery as a reaction to the cold and clinical scientific age. Again, we have the grandest mystery of the Holy Sacraments where God attaches Himself through the Word to earthly elements in order to give the forgiveness of sins won for us on the Cross of Christ. The God of the universe contains Himself and dwells with us in those means of Grace, assuring us of forgiveness and salvation which is truly the greatest mystery of all time. Our culture also wants the participatory, the experiential. We have the liturgy. We come together every week, hearing His Word proclaimed to us and joining our voices in speaking back to Him His very Words of life in the Divine Service.

Our culture is also starved for concrete connection with solid realities. There is nothing more "real" than Jesus Christ; and it is in the Divine Service where we come into the very Real Presence of the One True Living God, Who comes to us under the Means of Grace and serves our true needs of forgiveness, grace and eternal life. You can never be more "connected" to the Real God than participating in the One Who gives you His very Incarnate Body and Blood under the bread, wine and Word of His Supper. Here is where we are reminded of the reality of our sinful conditions and the joyous truth of our salvation through Jesus Christ alone. Our culture is fragmented and lost, needing a sense of family and community. We have the Unity that comes with being brought into the Body of Christ, the One True Christian Church through the faith that God the Holy Spirit creates and sustains in us. In this fellowship of the community of Christ we enjoy and are strengthened as we come together around His Word every Sunday morning.

Our culture seems to be without moral direction and substance. We have the baptismal life in Christ. We who have been reconnected through that blessed sacrament to the Living Vine of Christ, and have also been restored in the image of God and enabled to begin reflecting the will and ways of God to the people that God has placed around us. Our culture has questions and needs; in Christ, we have the only true answers. God grant us the grace to grow in our knowledge of Jesus Christ, and focus on Him, that we will be moved to share these answers with the people we interact with in our daily lives.
