

In this month's Church History section of The Carillon, we are continuing our series on the history and meaning of our church's stained-glass windows. The next window can be found on the west side of the church and is one of the two furthest back in the sanctuary before the fireside room. Only one window will be discussed this month since it has so much symbolism.

The **Ten Commandments Window** was given as a memorial in honor of Clara Larson.

Depicted in this window are the two tablets of stone on which the commandments were written by the finger of God; they are the fundamental principles of our Christian ethics and worship to this day.



The text of the Ten Commandments appears twice in the bible: once in Exodus and once in Deuteronomy. Since they aren't listed on the window and we can all use a refresher from time to time, the Ten Commandments are:

"You shall have no other gods.

You shall not make wrongful use of the name of the Lord your God.

Remember the sabbath day, and keep it holy. Honor your father and your mother.

You shall not murder.

You shall not commit adultery.

You shall not steal.

You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

You shall not covet your neighbor's house. You shall not covet...anything that belongs to your neighbor."

Above the tablets is the eye of God (or eye of Providence) with accompanying rays of light to depict His Power. This symbol is triangular to represent the trinity and is meant to remind us that His vision encompasses and watches over us in every direction. The last, and most unique, feature in this window are the staff and serpent depicted on the left tablet. This symbol can be interpreted as simply a reference to Moses. Numbers 21 tells the story of Moses being instructed to make a serpent of bronze to save the Israelites from poisonous snakes in the wilderness. To this day, it is recognizable as the healing emblem for the medical profession.



However, just like our other stained-glass windows in the church, there is a deeper connection being shown here between Jesus Christ and the Old Testament. John 3:16 is one of the most familiar verses in the bible: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life." The verses just before it – John 3:14-15 – are where the connection is made: Jesus said 14 "Just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, 15 that whoever believes in him may have eternal life."

Jesus makes direct comparison between the raising up of the Son of Man and the act of Moses in raising up the serpent as a sign, using it as a symbol associated with salvation.

The Pastor's Link



Perhaps you have heard it stated: "The Church is always one generation from disappearing".

It is the idea is that unless we teach our children the faith, and unless we are active in mission and outreach then the church can perish within the next generation. This statement shows not only an amazing amount of arrogance and trust in our own abilities, but more so an incredible lack of faith in our Lord, who has promised that the gates of hell shall not prevail against His Church.

Many well-meaning Christians and denominations try to "fix" the church in order to make it more successful, profitable and appealing. The thought is that the church is no longer the way Jesus intended it to be, and so it is up to "us" to try and start over, to get it right so it can be the church that God wants and He will bless it and us.

This "Theology of Glory" is the current 'fad'. It seems to be the only real tradition of American Christianity: the perpetual quest for a truly 'Spirit-filled' assembly of people that we can point to and say, "See! Those are true Christians!" And we believe that this "Church" can be found only on the other side of our "fix". THEN the mission could be accomplished. The "fixers" always come back to this same pattern of man-centered blunder.

If we can just find the right way to organize.

If We Can Just find the right way to worship.

If We Can Just find the right person to bring the two together, to stand in front and convince us that our way is the authentic way, then we will truly be "God's assembly."

Then we will be the real Church!

"If We Can Just": is the belief that God's blessings for the Church can be received by us only after we have first done_____ (you fill in the blank). "If We Can Just", then, is nothing more than the worship of our own efforts to fix the Church. Or more precisely; it is our "helping God" to "save His Church".

BUT:

What if the Church isn't an organization at all?

What if it isn't about human rituals so much as divine promises?

What if it doesn't need a charismatic leader so much as pure gospel preaching?

What if the churches are not gatherings of people in whom you find God, but the people gathered together because God has found them, called them, elected them, is gathering them with His Word alone? What if the congregating of the saints happens only because God sends His Gospel and gifts to be rightly preached and given in that place?

What if the true unity of the Church only needs the Gospel and faithful giving of the Sacraments?

What if all human traditions, all rites, all ceremonies, and institutions of men cannot add or detract from this reality?

What if salvation is completely Jesus' work?

What if His one Holy Church will continue until He returns, no matter what we do or don't do?

Is it possible God's Living Word is God's Word and is not affected by theology or reason or the institutions or commandments of men?


What if God sent twelve men into the world with one command: If you forgive the sins of anyone, they are forgiven. Baptize them into My name. Teach them My words. Trust Me on this one. In this, I am with you always, especially when it doesn't look like it or feel like it.

Well said! Yes, our Risen and Living Lord Jesus is with us. We need not ever fear for we are the Body of Christ. With all the fear and mad attempts to stave off the apparent collapse of American Christianity, remember the Church's future has never been nor ever will be in the hands of men. This is the great riddle of the Church's history from day one: the church lives because He lives. "He is risen!" In Him, in simple childlike faith in Him, the church has outlived the demise of civilizations. Are we so narcissistic as to believe that our age is so very different? The Church will live on... because that is the will of God. If God desires the Gospel to be preached among our children, then it WILL happen as surely the sun will rise tomorrow. So let us pray for it! We show a lack of faith in Jesus' ability to be our Savior when we seek charismatic visionary leaders who proclaim that without our adoption of this new program or that new strategy, then the Church shall surely perish.

What a comfort it is for us to know that our Lord is truly the Lord of His Church and that the gates of hell (and even our own misguided efforts) cannot prevail against the Church. The Lord is Lord of His Church, His Body, and He will always be with it and sustain it no matter what we do or don't do. What comfort and assurance there is when we trust that.
