### WE'RE WINDING UP OUR TIME CAPSULE PROJECT...

Dear Parents of Our Saviour's Children/ Youth –

Did you know that Our Saviour's Lutheran Church was born of a Sunday School? Yes, back in the year 1923, young parents paid rent to use an area church so their children could attend Sunday School. Looking back at our church history, it has become a tradition to celebrate every 25 years. So, as part of this year's 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Celebration of Our Saviour's Lutheran Church, we would like to bury a 25-year Centennial Time Capsule in the church yard – FOR THE CHILDREN/YOUTH!

We are asking you to encourage our youth and/or help your child gather meaningful items to include in a little Ziplock bag (AVAILABLE IN THE CHURCH OFFICE). Needless to say, items should be clean, dry, and nonperishable. We suggest entries like...

- A letter to God.
- A handwritten note to self.
- A favorite prayer.

- Special photos pets, family, friends, etc.
- A drawing/coloring page.
- A tiny toy, button, or meaningful trinket.
- Trading/collecting card.
- Any other item of meaning.

The size of our PVC time capsule will depend on how many Ziplock bags are turned in. We will bury the capsule in the church yard on September 10<sup>th</sup>. Many bags have already been turned in, and we will continue to accept them until September 3rd- so we can seal the capsule for the big day.

Please make sure names are clearly written, along with birthdate, on the label secured to the inside of each bag.

For the past 23 years, our church and Kijitonyama Lutheran Church, Dar es Salaam, Tanzania have enjoyed a companion relationship between our congregations. This relationship has been fostered through visits of our members to Dar es Salaam, and their members to Iron Mountain. This visitation stopped during the pandemic. We have been richly blessed as we shared our cultures and faith with each other during these visits. We have grown in understanding of our brothers and sisters in Christ, encouraged each other in our faith journeys, and come to count each other as family in Christ.

Our Tanzanian guests will be here from October 2-9. They will be staying at the Comfort Inn with the help of our Church Council – thank you very much! There is still much to consider and that is where we will need your help. We are planning on serving lunch and dinner at the church so we would appreciate donations of food items. You are also welcome to come and eat with our brothers and sisters, get to know them. Sunday school resumes on September 17. All children from Pre-Kindergarten (age 4) through sixth grade are welcome to join us. This year Sunday school <u>begins at 10:15</u> <u>and ends at 11:25</u>.

Pre-Kindergarten through fifth graders continue where we left off with our chronological study of the Bible. The activities we partake in vary week to week, but mainly consist of singing songs, re-enacting the biblical story, playing games, having snacks, watching short video clips, and making crafts!

This year the sixth graders join the Sunday school initially for singing. Afterwards, they break out into their own session for an introductory pre-confirmation study titled "Journey Through the Bible". The goal of this program is to bridge the gap between Sunday school and confirmation. Alternating between classroom discussion and video viewing sessions, the children are exposed to the full Biblical narrative across the Old and New Testaments. These lessons take place in the newly refurbished youth room and involve snacks on the video viewing we weeks!



Youth group also begins on September 17 and is for any student in grades 7-12. This year youth group **begins at 11:30 and ends at 12:30**. Please join us to play games, eat pizza and donuts, and discuss a biblical lesson.

We are excited to meet in our new youth room this year! The new room is located in the church basement (the old cinema room). We have fresh paint, new flooring, and new couches! We thank everyone for their support in remodeling the youth room!
